Cardboard Boat Regatta Rules and Guidelines July 27th

Construction Guidelines

- 1. The boat's hull must be made of corrugated cardboard and should be constructed and sealed with any of the following: tape, caulk, and/or glue. Your boat may be painted if done more than 24 hours prior to putting it in the water.
- 2. Only corrugated cardboard may be used on the boat. *Non-corrugated material may not be used (resin or wax-coated prohibited). No solid cardboard and no carpet roll tubes may be used to strengthen the hull or structure.*
- 3. Above the hull, the boat may include additional materials as long as the materials do not aid its flotation.
- 4. Oars or paddles must be created using materials, store bought will not be allowed. There same restrictions for boat construction apply to oar and paddle construction.
- 5. Each boat must carry at least two team members.
- 7. Boats must be a maximum width of 60" (5ft) and a maximum length of 84" (7ft). No height requirement.
- 8. Boats must be fully constructed before race day.

Race Guidelines

- 1. Have fun, be creative and always be safe! All participants must wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) at all times in or on the water. Failure to wear a PFD may result in team disqualification.
- 2. Motors are not permitted, so plan on bringing your own oar or paddle. Oars or paddles may be made of any material. Team members must supply their own towels.
- 3. Paddles and oars must be used as a means to propel through the water using a paddling motion. Using the paddle or oar to push off the pond basin may result in disqualification.
- 3. All participants must be wearing swim shoes, a bathing suit and shorts. Crew costumes are encouraged!
- 4. Teams are not allowed to sabotage anyone else's boat. Any rough housing will lead to disqualification.
- 5. Team members who start the race must finish the race without leaving the interior of the boat. Leaving the boat during the race will disqualify the entire team.
- 6. When a boat is finished with the race, the team must remove the boat and any leftover cardboard debris from the water area and dispose of it at the designated trash area.
- 7. Prizes for *Fastest Boat* in each group, as well as a prize for *Most Creative* design.

Duct tape

Acrylic latex caulk

Varnish

Utility knife

Measuring tape

Glue Straight edge

Paint (latex only)

Rope or string

Paint brush or roller

Scissors

*Feel free to bring water guns and water balloons

Restricted materials are as follows:

2 part paint (i.e. epoxy or polyester resin)

Flexseal or related products.

Styrofoam

Metal or metal foils

Plastic or wood

Staples, clamps, or screws

Pasteboard or chipboard

Plastic Bottles

Please read this form carefully and be aware that, in signing up and participating in the above program, you will be waiving and releasing all claims for injuries, arising out of this program, that you or the above participant might sustain. The terms, "I," "me," and "my" also refer to parents or guardians as well as the participants in the program. In registering for the program, you are agreeing as follows:			
As a participant in the program, I recognize and acknowledge that there are certain risks of physical injury, and I agree to assume the full risks of any injuries, including death, damages or loss which I may sustain as a result of participating, in any manner, in any and all activities connected with or associated with such program. I further recognize and acknowledge that all athletic activities involving strenuous exertion or potential body contact are hazardous recreational activities and involve substantial risks of injury.			
I waive and relinquish any and all claims I may have as a result of participating in the program against the Quincy Park District, Illinois Veterans Home, any and all other participating or cooperating governmental units, any and all independent contractors, officers, agents, servants and employees of the governmental bodies and independent contractors, and any and all other persons and entities, of whatever nature, that might be directly or indirectly liable for any injuries that I might sustain while participating in the program. Boat Construction Materials & Preparations

- Most construction materials can be found at local hardware stores
- Cardboard used can be sourced from many places as long as it follows the *construction guidelines*
- Large cardboard sheets can be purchased from the UPS Store
 - o 4 ft by 8 ft sheets can be ordered/bought for about \$9 a sheet
- Oars and paddles must be built following the same guidelines as the boat
- Please build your boat early so there is plenty of time for materials used to fully dry/cure
- Wearing water shoes during the event is recommended
 - It is not recommended to participate without some kind of foot protection
- All participants must wear a PFD(personal flotation device) at all times while on or in the water
- Make safety a priority when constructing your boat as well as during the event
